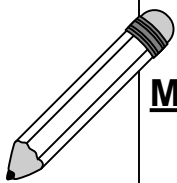
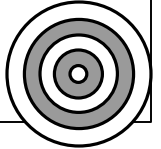


**QAR**

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**Purpose:** To help students focus on and critically analyze a text



**Materials:** reading selection, paper, pencils

**Procedure:**

- Divide students into small groups.
- Students develop 1 each of 4 question types. The question types are: 1) literal questions—can be answered by looking directly at the text; 2) inferential questions—can be answered by reading between the lines; 3) critical questions—can be answered through the application of prior knowledge to construct a reasonable answer; and 4) evaluative questions—can be answered by forming an opinion or generalization based on prior knowledge and personal meaning derived from the text.
- Student created questions can be used for other groups to answer or as discussion starters.
