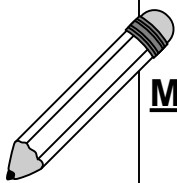
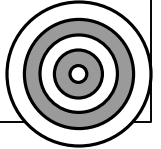


## Cubing

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**Purpose:** To synthesize knowledge by evaluating a topic from different viewpoints



**Materials:** paper, pencils

### **Procedure:**



- Students each fold a piece of paper into thirds vertically, and then in half horizontally.
- In the first section, describe the topic.
- In the second section, write how the topic relates to you.
- In the third section, write what you can do with the topic.
- In the fourth section, write the parts or components of the topic.
- In the fifth section, compare and contrast the topic with another topic of your choice.
- In the last section, express your opinion about the topic and defend it.
- Share responses with a partner or a group.
