Sometimes I put my umbrella down and tried to catch snow in my mouth. When I kicked my ball it made a path in the snow.

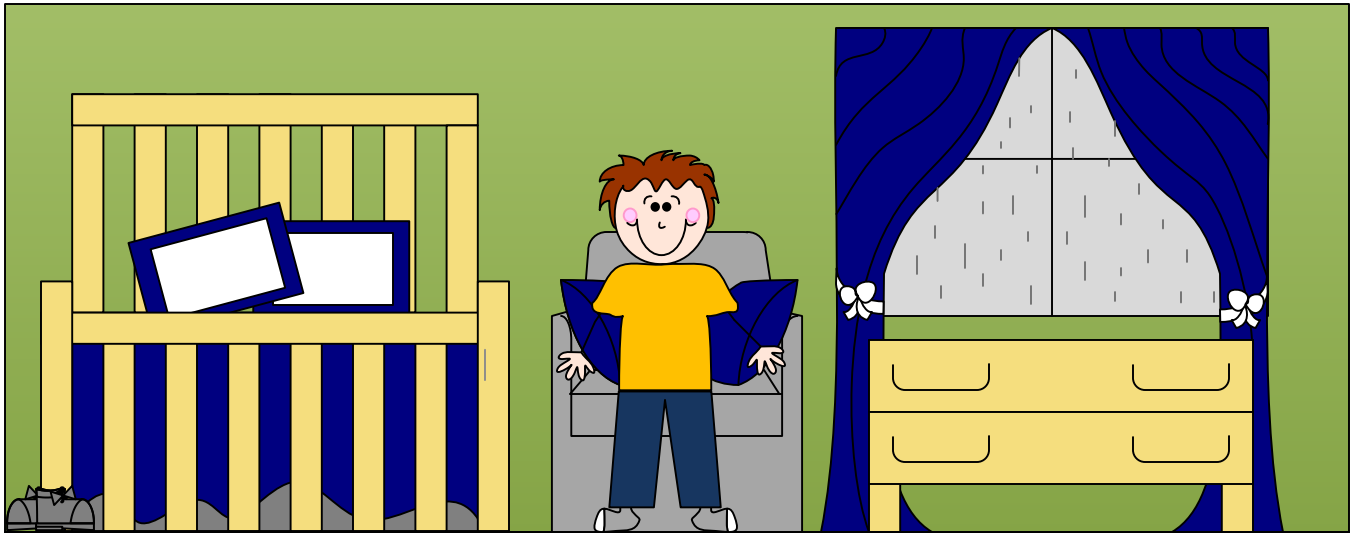
