



The Knights Who Kneel






Kate, Nell and Tate are knights. They have helmets and capes.

Their job is to stand at the gate to the castle each day. They keep others from going inside the castle.




When someone walks up to the gate, the knights yell "Kneel!" and they all kneel. They make a wall that no one can get past.




When the knights are not at the gate, they like to do things that others like to do. They like to shop. They like to eat good snacks. They like to play with friends.

"You can do that?" asked Kate.


"Yes," said the man. "Just give me one day and you will break your habit."
