

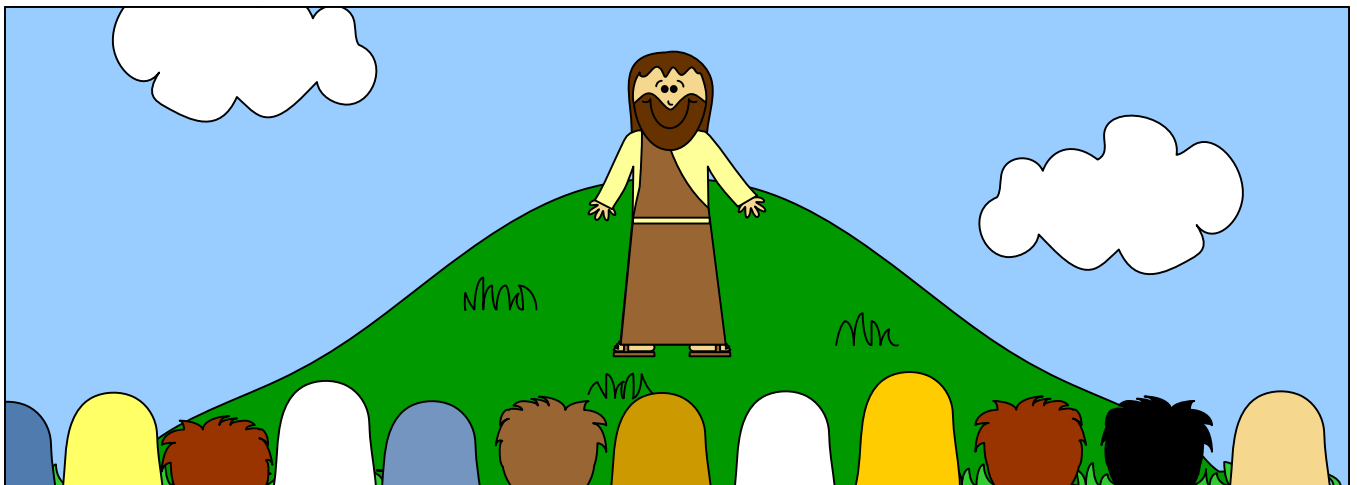


The Parable of the Workers in the Vineyard

Jesus told many parables. Parables are stories that help us know how we should live. One parable Jesus told was about workers in a vineyard.

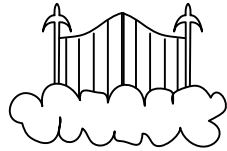

a denarius, which was what men got paid most of the

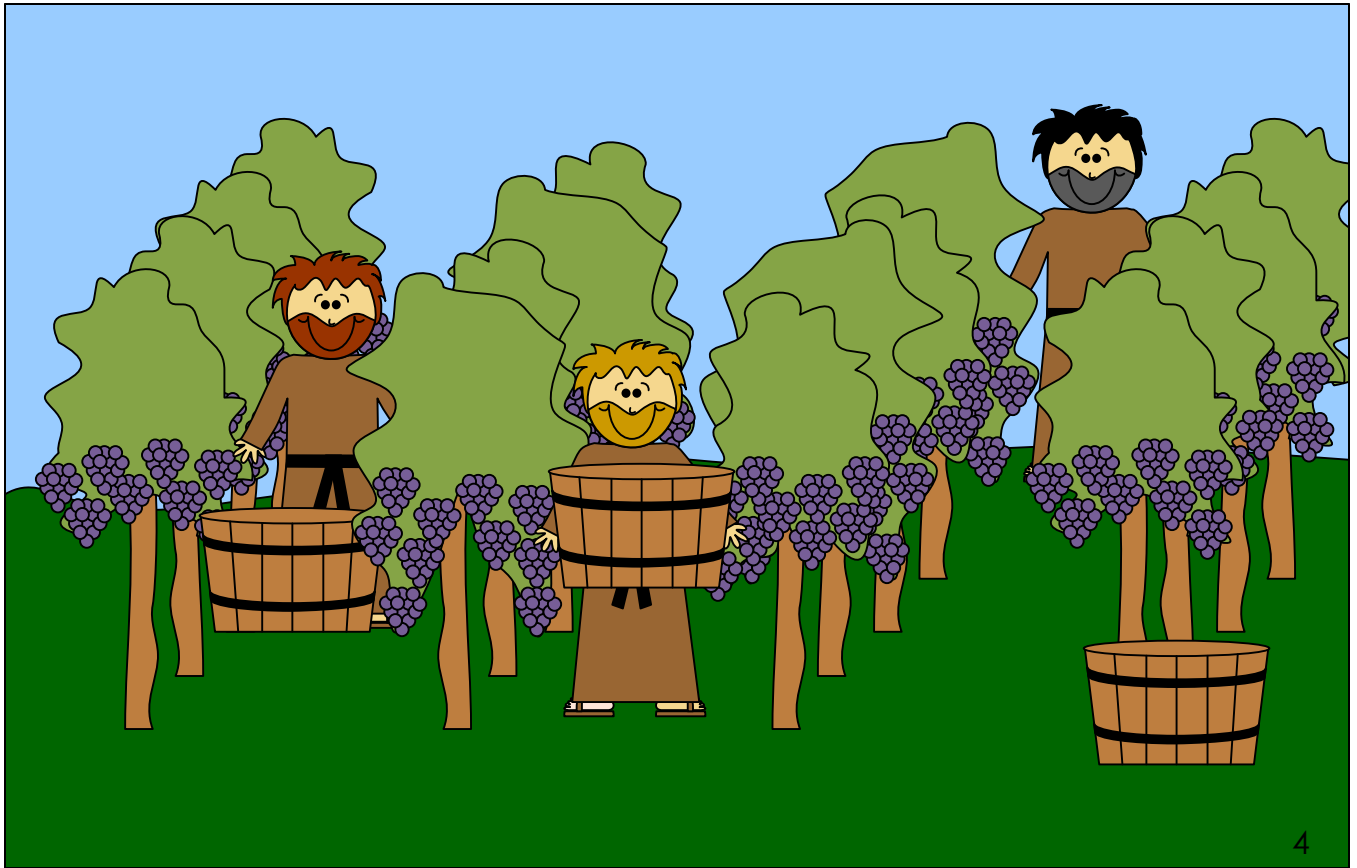


time when they worked for one day.

So they got busy working in the vineyard.



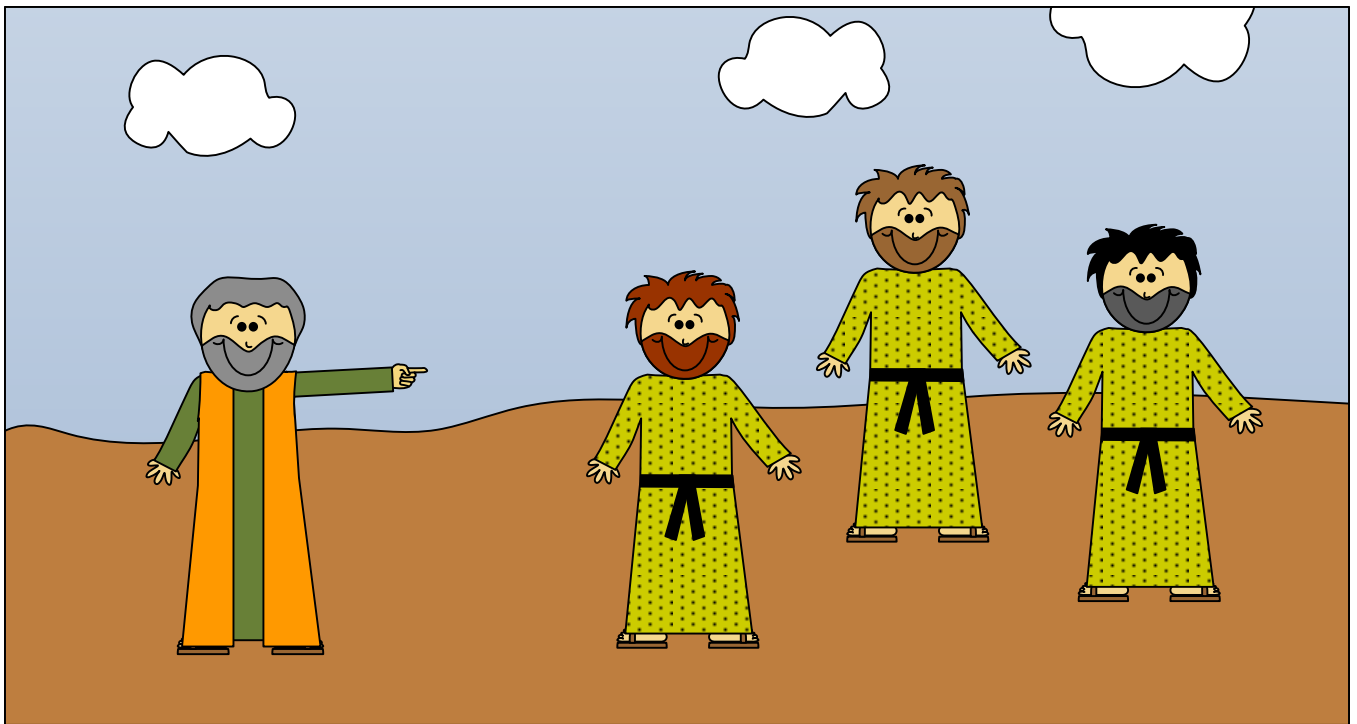
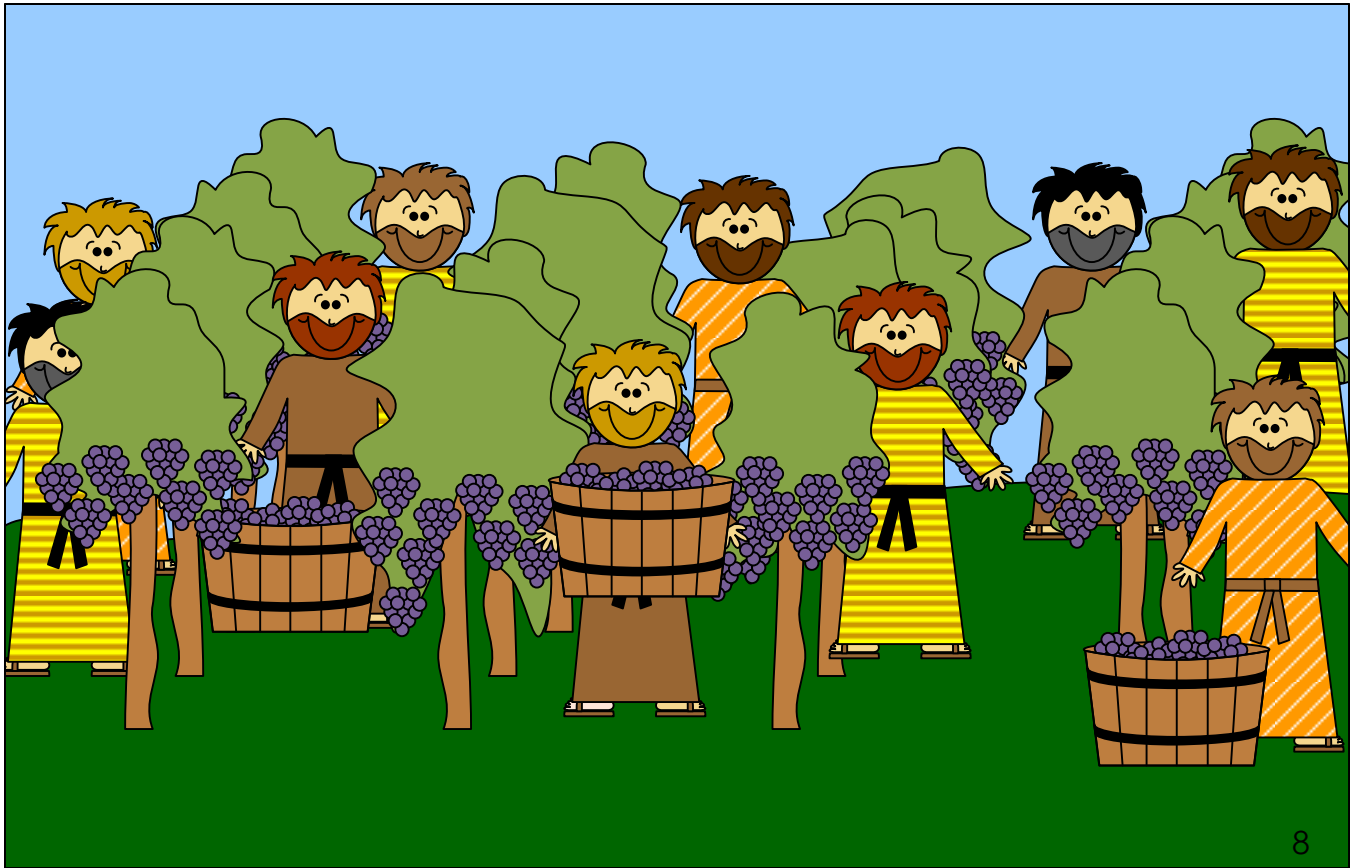


About nine in the morning, he saw more men who wanted to work. He told them to go work in his vineyard  and he would pay them what was right.

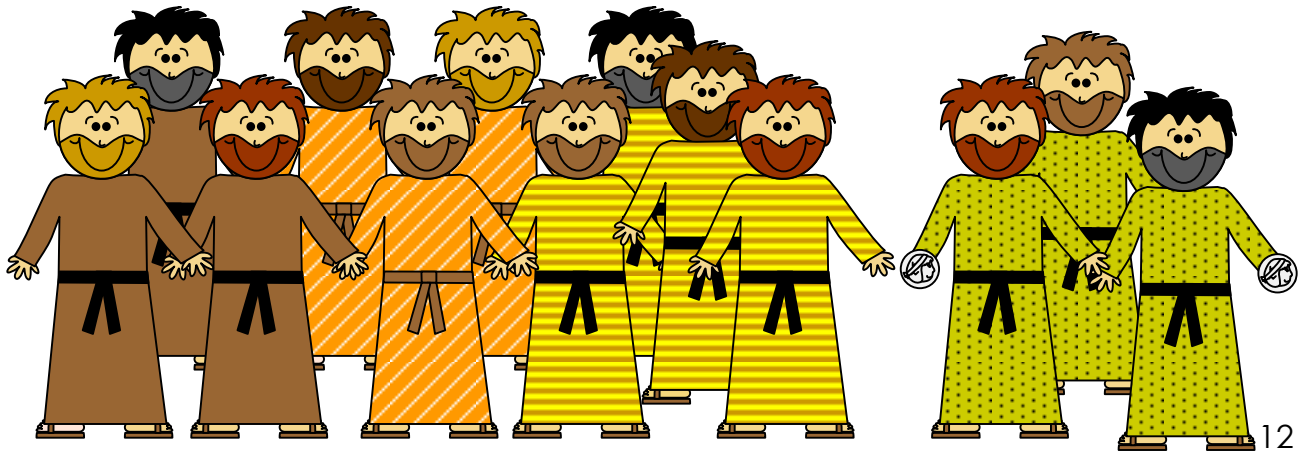
The workers who were hired last, near the end of the day, came and each got one denarius.

hired last the same money I gave you. It is my money

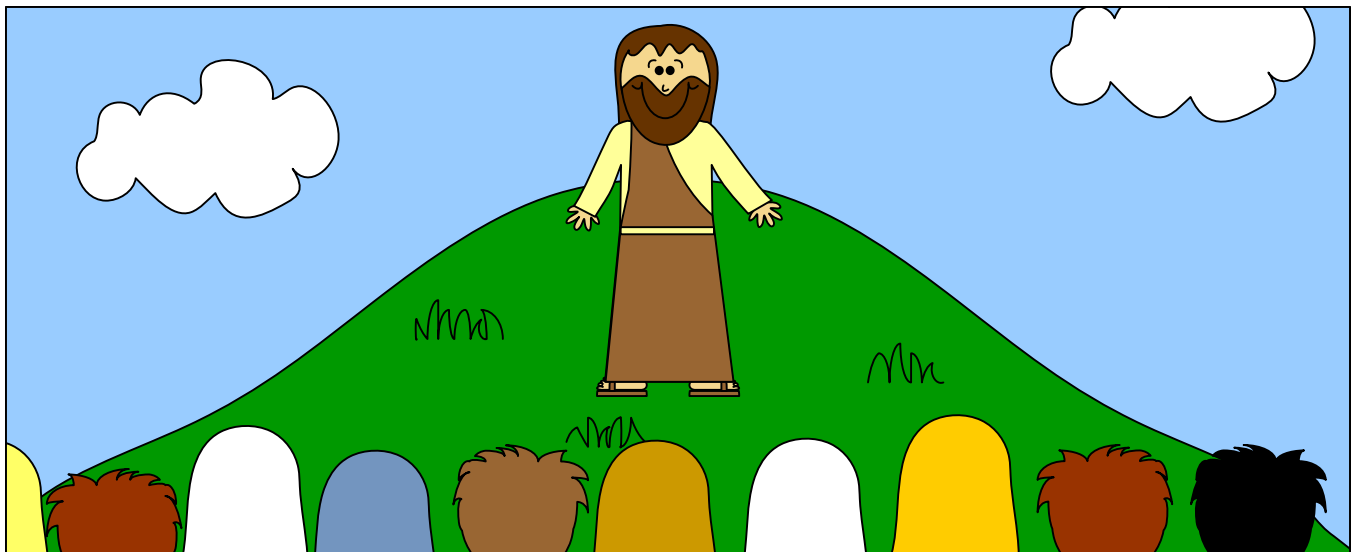
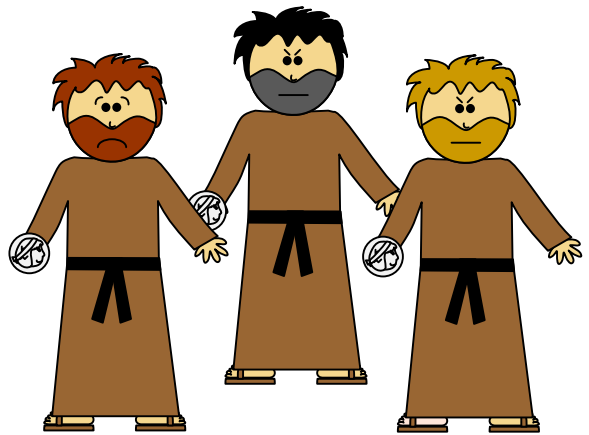


and I can pay them what I want. Are you upset
